The Board of Supervisors of Calhoun County met with the following members present: Nicholson, Jacobs, and Hoag, Sr.

The minutes of the last meeting were read. It was moved by Hoag, Sr. and seconded by Jacobs to approve the minutes. Ayes all. Motion carried.

It was moved by Jacobs and seconded by Hoag, Sr. to review the claims (checks #35580 through 35783 and warrants 502687 through 502703) and were allowed as endorsed. Ayes all. Motion carried.

It was moved by Jacobs and seconded by Hoag, Sr. to authorize the Chairman to sign the Application for Approval of Construction Across Established Calhoun County Drainage Districts being District #264 to Windstream Communications, Inc. Ayes all. Motion carried.

Theresa Hildreth, Administrative Director of Chamber of Commerce, met with the Board concerning Avenue of Lights on the courthouse square and trees decorated. The holiday of lights will be held Sunday, December 15th.

Ron Haden, Engineer; Steve Goins, Assistant to the Engineer; and B.J. Musselman, Shop Foreman, met with the Board to update them on Secondary Road projects.

It was moved by Jacobs and seconded by Hoag, Sr. to approve Underground Permit #26-2013 for Communication Data Link, LLC to place 1184' of coaxial cable on the east side Section 1, Jackson Township. Ayes all. Motion carried.

ORDINANCE 2013-4
STREETS, ROADS, & PUBLIC HIGHWAYS
ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE UNLAWFUL USE OF ENGINE AND COMPRESSION BRAKES ("JAKE BRAKE ORDINANCE")

Section 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to prohibit the excessive, loud, unusual or explosive use of engine and compressed air-braking devices within designated areas in Calhoun County.

Section 2. DEFINITIONS. For the purposes of this ordinance the following words and phrases are defined as follows:

"Engine retarding brake" means a "Dynamic Brake," "Jake Brake," "Jacobs Brake," "C-Brake," "Paccar Brake," transmission brake or any other engine retarding brake system that alters the normal compression of the engine and subsequently releases that compression.

Section 3. PROHIBITIONS. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to

use or operate or cause to be used or operated within designated areas in the unincorporated areas of the County of Calhoun, State of Iowa, any engine brake, compression brake or mechanical exhaust device designed to aid in the braking or deceleration of any vehicle that results in excessive, loud, unusual or explosive noise from such vehicle, unless such use is necessary to avoid imminent danger. Such prohibition shall be applicable only to those public highways or portions specifically identified in Section 4.

Section 4. AREAS OF PROHIBITION. The prohibition set forth herein shall apply to the following public highways in Calhoun County, Iowa or portions thereof:

1. County Road N28 between one mile south and one mile north of the intersection of N28 with D36 (formerly Highway 20).

Section 5. SIGNAGE. Signs stating "VEHICLE NOISE LAWS ENFORCED" or "ENGINE BRAKE ORDINANCE ENFORCED" may be installed at locations deemed appropriate by the Board of Supervisors to advise motorists of the prohibitions contained in this ordinance, except that no sign stating "VEHICLE NOISE LAWS ENFORCED" or "ENGINE BRAKE ORDINANCE ENFORCED" shall be installed on a state highway without a permit from the Iowa Department of Transportation. The provisions of this ordinance shall be in full force and effect even if no signs are installed.

Section 6. EXCEPTIONS. Emergency vehicles shall be exempt from the application of this ordinance.

Section 7. ENFORCEMENT. This ordinance is deemed to be a county infraction. It shall be enforced pursuant to #96-1 of Calhoun County's Code of Ordinances.

Section 8. ADOPTION. This ordinance will take effect upon final publication. Ayes all. Motion carried.

Pam Anderson, Director Economic Development, met with the Board to update on truck stop project. Also present was Joan Wagner, County Assessor. The Development Agreement was reviewed.

Gregg Heide, farmer near Pomeroy, met with the Board concerning wind turbine tax valuations. Also present were Joan Wagner, County Assessor and Pam Anderson, Director Economic Development. Gregg discussed wind turbine valuation comparison with Pocahontas County. Joan advised that the valuations are calculated from a formula with information provided by the taxpayer.
