It was moved by Nicholson and seconded by Jacobs to review the claims (checks #38705 through 38830) and warrants #502879 through 502894) and were allowed as endorsed. Ayes all. Motion carried.

A call was received from Webster County Board of Supervisors concerning JT DD 12 Webster-38 Calhoun for approval of change order and pay estimate.

Ron Haden, Engineer, and B.J. Musselman, Maintenance Supervisor, met with the Board to update them on Secondary Road projects.

It was moved by Nicholson and seconded by Jacobs to approve Underground Permit #16-2014 to Ryan Hildreth to bore electrical service under N57 inside Rockwell City limits. Ayes all. Motion carried.

Eric Yunginger, Engineer, I&S Group, Storm Lake, met with the Board to update them on drainage projects. Eric discussed JT DD 37-35 completion of the project, DD 197 repair under railroad, DD 67 repair cost, and pipeline coming across Calhoun County.

Julie Busby, Prevention Specialist, and Tiffany Dorsey from Community & Family Resources, met with the Board concerning National Recovery Month. It was moved by Nicholson and seconded by Jacobs to approve the following:

National Recovery Month 2014-18

Mental and substance use disorders affect all communities nationwide, but with commitment and support, people with these disorders can achieve healthy lifestyles and lead rewarding lives in recovery. In 2011, 3.8 million people aged 12 or older received specialty treatment for an illicit drug or alcohol use problem in the past year, and more than 31.6 million adults aged 18 or older received mental health services in the past year. By seeking help, people who experience mental and/or substance use disorders can embark on a new path toward improved health and overall wellness. The focus of National Recovery Month this September is to celebrate their journey. Recovery Month spreads the message that behavioral health is an essential part of health and one's overall wellness, and that prevention works, treatment is effective, and people recover. This is a message we need to spread far and wide. With 392,000 Iowans having a mental illness and 216,000 Iowans having a substance use disorder in 2011, the impact of mental and substance use disorders is apparent in our local community. Frequently, mental illness and substance use disorders are experienced together, magnifying the devastating consequences of both. According to the 2011 National Survey on Drug Use and Health, in 2011, 21.6 million people aged 12 or older nationwide needed treatment for an illicit drug or alcohol use problem (8.4 percent of people aged 12 or older). Of these, 2.3 million (0.9 percent of people aged 12 or older and 10.8 percent of those who needed treatment) received treatment at a specialty facility. Also in 2011, out of the 45.6 million Americans aged 18 or older who had any mental illness in the past year, only 31.6 million received mental health services in the past year. Through Recovery Month, people become more aware and able to recognize the signs of mental and/or substance use disorders, which can lead more people into needed treatment. Managing the effects of these conditions can help people achieve healthy lifestyles, both physically and emotionally. For 24 years, Recovery Month has worked to improve the lives of those affected by mental and/or substance use disorders by raising awareness of these diseases and educating communities about the prevention, treatment, and recovery resources that are available. For the above reasons, I am asking the citizens of Calhoun County to join me in celebrating this September as National Recovery Month. I, Scott Jacobs, Chairman of the Board, do hereby proclaim the month of September 2014 as National Recovery Month In Calhoun County and call upon our community to observe this month with compelling programs and events that support this year's observance. Ayes all. Motion carried.
